The Latent Prints examiner will routinely utilize AFIS and other automated systems in the completion of the daily job requirements. This position will use current, state of the art equipment, analytical instrumentation, methodologies, and proven techniques and reporting methods in the field of Friction Ridge Analysis/Latent Prints Examination. OR

Associates degree from an accredited college or university in the fields of Forensic Science, Criminalistics, Criminal Justice, one of the natural sciences (Chemistry, Biology, Physics) or a related science field AND three (3) years of documented work experience in the processing, recovery, visualizing/recording, analyzing, and/or comparing latent prints to include the working knowledge and operation of Automated Fingerprint Identification Systems.

Must possess and be prepared to demonstrate professional knowledge of the principles, theories, methods and technical procedures used to process materials for latent prints, recovery of latent prints, visualizing/recording or latent prints and examining and comparing latent prints to known fingerprints in a forensic laboratory.
